- Nominee must not hold another industry-sponsored full fellowship while they are an Apple Scholar in AI/ML (Fall 2022 to Summer 2024)

2. Research Abstract (200 word maximum)
3. Research statement covering past work and proposed direction for next 2 years (5-page maximum, including citations)

5. Link to most recent published work (optional)
