The Fellowships directly support graduate students as they pursue their PhD and connect them to a Google Research Mentor. Fellowship students are a select group recognized by Google researchers and their institutions as some of the most promising young academics in the world who represent the future of research in the following fields:

- Algorithms, Optimizations and Markets
- Computational Neuroscience
- Health Research
- Human-Computer Interaction
- Machine Learning
- Machine Perception, Speech Technology and Computer Vision
- Mobile Computing
- Natural Language Processing (including Information Retrieval and Extraction)
- Privacy and Security
- Programming Languages and Software Engineering
- Quantum Computing
- Structured Data and Database Management
- Systems and Networking

Eligibility & Requirements:

- Must be a full-time graduate student pursuing a PhD.
- Must complete graduate coursework by the academic award year when the Fellowship begins.
- Students must remain enrolled full-time in the PhD program for the duration of the Fellowship or forfeit the award.
- Google employees, and their spouses, children, and members of their household are not eligible.
- Students already supported by a comparable industry award are not eligible.
- If a university chooses to nominate more than two students, then in order to increase opportunities for students who are underrepresented in the field of computing the third and fourth nominees must self-identify as a woman, Black/African descent, Hispanic/Latino/Latinx, Indigenous, and/or a person with a disability.

Internal Nomination Process:

Interested applicants should submit the following documents:

1. [JHU Limited Submission Cover Sheet](#)
2. Research / dissertation proposal (maximum of two pages of text only, single spaced: 12-pt font and one-inch margins) (Note: figures, tables, and other reference material may be included in addition to the 2 pg. text limit)
3. One letter of recommendation from thesis advisor
4. CV with website links and publications (if applicable) for student **and** primary advisor
5. Current and previous academic transcripts
