Opportunity Summary

This announcement encourages Collaborative Program Grant applications that propose to conduct research to address complex and challenging biomedical problems, important for the <u>mission of NIGMS</u>, through deeply integrated, multidisciplinary research teams. The Grant is designed to support research in which funding a team of interdependent investigators offers significant advantages over support of individual research project grants. Applications should address critical issues and be sufficiently challenging, ambitious, and innovative that objectives could not be achieved by individual investigators.

Applications may address any area of science within the NIGMS mission, which is to support basic research that increases understanding of biological processes at a range of levels, from molecules and cells to tissues, whole organisms and populations.

Eligibility & Requirements:

- Consultation with relevant staff at least 10 weeks prior to the application due date is strongly encouraged.
- A multiple PD/PI application is required and must include a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 6 PD/PIs who are all necessary to provide sufficient research capacity and the relevant expertise to address the proposed scientific problem.
- Early Stage Investigators and new investigators who participate as PD/PIs will lose their early stage status for future NIH applications, but ESI leads of pilot studies will not lose ESI status.
- PD/PIs who have an active <u>NIGMS R35 award</u> can participate as PD/PIs as part of the 51% effort on their current R35 award but may not receive additional funds from this award.
- Applicants with <u>substantial unrestricted research support</u> may receive funding from this award as their one NIGMS grant award, or may participate in an unfunded advisory or consulting role without loss of their ability to receive one funded NIGMS grant, consistent with <u>NIGMS policies</u>.

Internal Nomination Process:

Interested applicants should submit the following documents:

- 1. JHU Limited Submission Cover Sheet
- Proposal (maximum of two pages of text only, single spaced: 12-pt font and one-inch margins) (Note: figures, tables, and other reference material may be included in addition to the 2 pg. text limit)
- 3. Curriculum Vitae of investigator, including current external research support and publications
- 4. Budget (two pages maximum)
